



Job Description – Farm Project Assistant

Job Summary:

The Farm Project Assistant plays a crucial role in supporting the delivery of group sessions and educational programs to school/college cohorts and groups from external organisations. Working closely with Project Leaders, the Farm Project Assistant ensures engaging and enriching experiences for all service users. This position contributes to fostering a connection with nature and promoting learning through hands-on activities.

Responsibilities:

- Assist Project Leaders in delivering group sessions and educational programs.
- Collaborate with the education team to prepare and deliver engaging sessions.
- Actively engage with participants during sessions, promoting learning and exploration.
- Maintain safe learning environments, adhering to health and safety protocols.
- Participate in team meetings and contribute ideas for service improvement.

Purpose of the Post:

To assist in the development and implementation of farm-based educational programs for school groups and adults, promoting independence and personal growth through hands-on activities and support.

Principal Duties May Include, But Are Not Limited To, the Following:

- Facilitate and lead educational sessions for school groups and adult clients.
- Support the development and delivery of tailored programs that encourage independence and self-sufficiency.
- Support clients/participants in both group settings and one-on-one interactions.
- Collaborate with team members to ensure high-quality service delivery.
- Assist in the planning and organization of farm activities and events.
- Maintain a safe and welcoming environment for all participants.





• Monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of programs, providing feedback for continuous improvement.

Safeguarding:

- **Essential:** Background working with young people, vulnerable groups, and those with challenging behaviours.
- Proven professional background in educational settings (SEN) or care.
- Strong interpersonal skills to effectively motivate and engage others.
- A proactive attitude that embraces challenges and problem-solving.
- Excellent organizational skills with a strong focus on customer service.
- Proficient literacy and computer skills.
- Working knowledge of first aid and health & safety protocols relevant to outdoor settings.
- Willingness to work in an off-grid, practical farm environment.
